# ALL COMPLETED ENTRY FORMS, REQUIRED DOCUMENTS AND SIGNATURES MUST BE RECEIVED PRIOR TO ARRIVAL

PPFHA Disclaimer: All individuals (including, but not limited to, service providers, competition staff, volunteers, and licensed officials) who enter the venue must sign the Piedmont PFHA Waiver and Release, page 19.

Piedmont PFHA (PPFHA) is eager for you and your horses to return to competition!

We also recognize the huge responsibility that comes with returning to competition. We take this responsibility very seriously and are already at work to ensure that the return of our volunteers, staff, officials, exhibitors, owners, and trainers can be managed safely and successfully.

Piedmont PFHA Officers and Board Members are committed to providing a safe and fun experience for all show attendees, staff volunteers and officials, especially as we emerge from coronavirus (COVID-19) restrictions.

Although the Paso Fino Horse Association (PFHA) has waived qualification points to compete at the 2020 Grand National Show (GNS), we feel it is important to provide an opportunity to attend a competition prior to the 2020 GNS.

The show will be a one-day competition with an abbreviated show schedule. Show management will accept and approve exhibitor requests to combine and/or split and/or add classes as much as reasonably possible. Show Management will make every effort to ensure classes are not missed.

# There will be no spectators allowed during the event.

In conjunction with T. Ed Garrison Arena, local, state and federal recommendations and mandates, including those from the World Health Organization (WHO), Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and United States Equestrian Federation (USEF), the following guidelines have been implemented to alleviate the potential impact of COVID-19 and to ensure that the re-introduction of horse shows is smooth, efficient and most importantly, safe for all involved.

Thank you in advance for abiding by these guidelines while visiting our venue and for your ongoing support of Piedmont PFHA.

# Piedmont PFHA Officers and Board of Directors

Public/Spectators – For purposes of this document, spectators refers to the general public, fans, or any individuals who are not directly involved in the competition by way of being a participant (owner and/or exhibitor), a member of competition staff, a service provider (e.g. media or photographer), volunteer, or other support personnel (farrier, veterinarian, etc.).

# PFHA, USEF MEMBERSHIPS AND SAFE SPORT TRAINING MUST BE CURRENT AT TIME ENTRIES ARE RECEIVED

USEF has developed a comprehensive approach to returning to competition with appropriate COVID-19 protocols. PPFHA has used these guidelines as the basis for our plan. In addition, we have utilized the WHO/FEI risk assessment to measure the effectiveness of our planning efforts. With the use of this risk assessment, we have been able to determine that with all policies and practices applied, we are operating at a low level of risk.

You will see signage, reminders, and information around the facility that will remind all of us of the importance of using personal protective equipment (PPE), handwashing and social distancing. We will do what we can to ensure we do not grow complacent with practices we know will help all of us stay safe. WEAR---a mask.

WAIT---6 feet apart.

Social distancing is our norm.

WASH---your hands for 30 seconds with soap and water or 80% alcohol hand sanitizer, often

All employees, competitors, and visitors on the T. Ed Garrison Arena property must wear face masks or face coverings at all times, with the exception of when actively riding and must practice social distancing at all times while on competition grounds by staying at least 6 feet (about 2 arms' length) from any person who is not a member of their immediate household. Members of the same household are stil required to wear masks or face coverings when there is a possibility of being within six feet of any other individuals, including members of their own household.

No Spectators allowed

Registered guests and essential personnel only permitted on property

Gatherings are restricted to 10 people or less

Volunteers, Staff and Officials of PPFHA will have temperature monitoring daily. No person will be allowed to work if any symptoms or temperatures exist. We request that barns with multiple competitors/employees be responsible for monitoring the daily temperatures of each individual, ensuring protection for your teams and those around you.

We also request that individuals self-monitor and not remain on property if any concerns exist about an individual's wellbeing.

If you are not feeling well or have any symptoms of illness, please stay home!

As practically as possible, we are creating a touchless process for engagement with horse show operations. We desire to create a seamless, touchless process that will become our "new normal" as it best protects you and simplifies the processes of doing business.

All entries and signed releases must be emailed prior to arrival and must be complete! NO EXCEPTIONS!! All stabling registration must be done electronically through the show secretary's email, julicaldred@att.net

# **MANDATORY REQUIREMENTS FOR PARTICIPANTS**

Participants are required to comply with these and any additional Competition Organizer requirements at all times while present on competition grounds. Failure to do so may result in expulsion from the grounds. These requirements are in effect immediately and until further notice, however, they are subject to revisions as the COVID-19 virus environment changes.

Waiver/Release & Indemnity Agreement must provide emergency contact information and execute an updated Waiver and Release of Liability, Assumption of Risk and Indemnity Agreement as a condition of participation.

Participants and Support Personnel are required to self-monitor their temperature once daily prior to entering the competition grounds. Anyone with a temperature of 99.5° F (37.5° C) or higher may not enter the facility.

- Anyone who:
  - exhibits COVID-19 symptoms,
  - has tested positive for COVID-19 within last two weeks, or
  - has been in contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 within the last two weeks\*

cannot enter the competition grounds.

- \*Exception: Healthcare personnel who have treated patients using appropriate medical grade PPE during the course of performing professional duties are exempted from this restriction.
- Refer to Appendix A for CDC guidelines for self-isolation/quarantine directives in the event a person has a fever or exhibits other symptoms of COVID-19.
- Participants and Support Personnel are required to wear a facemask or face covering when in any setting where there is a possibility of being within six feet of other individuals, and when not mounted on a horse. You can find recommendations for proper use of face masks and face coverings via the Centers for Disease Control & Prevention website.
- \*\*A participant may choose to wear a facemask or face covering when mounted on a horse and cannot be disqualified or penalized for doing so while competing.
- If any person who was present on the competition grounds tests positive for COVID-19 within 14 days of the conclusion of competition, USEF must be notified immediately. Direct USEF reports to ksacco@usef.org
- Comply with social distancing requirements at all times while on the competition grounds.
- Wash hands often and adhere to other sanitization practices throughout the day.

# **Awards and Ribbons:**

Awards and Ribbons will not be presented to minimize close contact.

<u>Camping:</u> All requirements as listed in this document regarding social distancing, wearing of masks, and temperature monitoring must be followed while camping on the event grounds.

# **Enforcement of Social Distancing:**

The use of a mask or face covering does not exempt anyone from maintaining a 6-foot distance from another person. If social distancing and/or mandatory requirements are not followed at the competition, it must be reported to the Competition Manager and the Show Steward at the competition. These matters should be handled immediately at the competition, if possible. The Show Steward will inform individuals when they are in violation of the mandatory requirements and will be documented. If a second warning is issued, Competition Management will facilitate the removal of an individual with no refund! The Show Steward must report instances of non-compliance in the Show Steward Report.

# **Entry Process**

All entry forms, signed releases, and payment are required prior to arrival. PFHA & USEF MEMBERSHIPS MUST BE CURRENT. SAFE SPORT TRAINING MUST BE COMPLETED

Once all forms are received and processed, you will be assigned a back number.

The entry process will remain open until July 20.

Entries will be limited by maximums allowed per ring per day.

# **Essential Support Persons:**

Support personnel must be limited to one person per horse besides the competitor. Parents are considered Essential Personnel for Junior exhibitors. At all times while on venue grounds, essential support persons for each horse, including riders, trainers and grooms during competition, must be identifiable by wearing an entry number ID of the horse they are supporting.

# Face masks or face coverings:

Face masks or face coverings are required when outdoors in any setting where there is a possibility of being within six feet of other individuals with the exception of when actively riding. All competitors, grooms, trainers, and essential support personnel and all officials, staff, volunteers, and other participants are required to wear face masks or face covering. Face masks and face coverings must fully cover the nose and the mouth while being worn.

Face masks are required at all times inside the building.

<u>Limit of Entries:</u> If a state or locality imposes restrictions and/or an organizer's ability to accept out of state entries or imposes limitations on the number of individuals allowed at a group gathering, that ordinance will guide the competition's ability to operate and dictate the number of individuals allowed at the venue.

# **Personal Protective Equipment (PPE):**

PPFHA will not provide PPE, disinfectants, or thermometers to participants. PPFHA will provide sanitation stations throughout the grounds with either soap and water, hand sanitizer, or both.

Participants are required to wash hands often and adhere to other sanitization practices throughout the day. It is incumbent upon them to bring supplies as well.

PPFHA will provide PPE to their competition staff, volunteers, and officials.

Participants are responsible for their own PPE and that of their support teams.

PPFHA will not provide masks to competitors.

# **Restricted Access to Event Venues:**

Competition Management will arrange temperature monitoring upon arrival each day for staff, officials, service providers and volunteers entering the venue grounds. Any person who has a

temperature of 99.5° F (37.5° C) or higher or has symptoms of COVID-19 will not be allowed to enter the competition grounds. Additionally, except for healthcare personnel who have treated patients using appropriate medical-grade PPE during the course of performing professional duties, anyone who has been in contact with a person who has tested positive for COVID-19 in the past 14 days cannot enter the competition grounds.

# **Stabling Areas:**

Social distancing will be enforced in the stabling area. Stabling areas will be strictly limited to essential personnel during limited operations. Horses will be spread out between barns. Individual competitors not affiliated with a competing barn or group will be assigned to separate ends of aisles. Hand sanitizing stations will be placed at each barn.

Handwashing or Hand Sanitization is encouraged before entering stabling area. Individuals should touch only the equipment and supplies necessary for completing tasks of caring for and exercising the specific horse(s). They should not share equipment between individuals - helmets, grooming supplies, tack, etc.

Water buckets and feed buckets/tubs should be in a fixed position within the stall to ensure feed or water can be provided without touching or removing these items.

The coronavirus can survive in the air up to three hours, on copper up to four hours, on cardboard up to 24 hours, and on stainless steel and plastic up to 72 hours.

The virus may persist on nonporous materials (leather bridles/saddles/halters, nylon halters/lead ropes, gate latches, door handles, spray nozzles) longer than porous materials (cotton lead ropes, saddle pads). Suggestions for exhibitors:

Clean communal leather tack daily with tack cleaner.

Disinfect stall door handles, gate latches, crosstie snaps, light switches, feed scoops, hose ends, spray nozzles, pitchforks, wheelbarrows, and other frequently handled surfaces regularly or after contact with personnel. Although there is no evidence that horses can contract or become ill from COVID-19, good hygiene should be practiced by washing hands or using at least 70% alcohol hand sanitizer after touching a horse, communal areas, or communal equipment to prevent environmental spread of the virus.

# Warm up Rings/Areas

The number of horses and people allowed in rings at one time to practice social distancing will be posted. All people must practice social distancing.

If any person who was present on the competition grounds tests positive for COVID-19 within 14 days of the conclusion of competition, they must immediately notify USEF. Direct USEF reports to ksacco@usef.org.

We ask that competitors regularly sanitize your bikes/motorbikes/golf carts/car and truck door handles, stable doors, bucket handles, light switches and equipment including: tack, grooming, feeding, stall cleaning materials, etc. Please provide gloves and masks to your barn staff and other personnel.

- All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the show management whose decision shall be final.
- Every horse entered for competition will comply with the rules of the horse show management, but
  management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be
  condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold this horse show and the officials and employees of the
  show blameless for any loss or accident to his horse, employees, equipment, which may occur from
  sickness, fire or otherwise.
- The management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit entries and cancel award prizes without claims for damages; to cancel or combine unfilled classes, or to reschedule classes after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings or rotate judges.
- Exhibitors are notified that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the judges or officials, on the part of the owner, manager, rider, or groom shall disqualify the horse, and the owner shall forfeit his entry fee and other fees.
- Show management reserves to itself the power to prohibit any person from attending or showing a horse in the ring and to remove any groom or horse from the show without being liable for compensation.
- In accordance with the 1989 Federal Waste Tracking Act, which restricts the disposal of medical waste, bio-hazardous medical waste containers will be provided in the stable area.
- All exhibitors and their agents are responsible for the proper disposal of this waste.
- No person will be allowed in the show ring during the time of judging except the exhibitor and those having official or requested duties to perform.
- It is the tradition of the show that riders be correctly attired for the class in question, that attendants be neatly dressed and the horses properly presented.
- Management may in its discretion bar any person from entering the ring if not suitable presented to appear before an audience.

# **GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS**

FAILURE TO COMPLY WILL BE CONSIDERED AN ACT OF DISCOURTESY AND WILL RESULT IN ADDITIONAL FEES.

ADMISSION OF HORSES: Stalls will be available on Friday, July 24, 2020 at 8am. No early arrivals will be accepted without prior approval of the show chairperson. Early arrivals will be charged a \$15 fee per day, per stall, including tack stalls. Early arrival will begin Thursday, July 23, 2020 at NOON. UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES ARE YOU TO STABLE HORSES IN ANY STALLS OTHER THAN THOSE DESIGNATED FOR YOU. All non-stalled horses must pay a \$25 per day grounds fee.

CAMPERS: Campers and RVs must be parked in designated areas, which are on a "first come, first served" basis. Electrical boxes on the camper spaces will be locked. You must come to the show office to have the box unlocked. Any vehicle connected to electricity and/or water will be considered a camper and will be charged the camper fee. Campers arriving late or after office hours must be prepared to be fully self-contained until the office opens and the power can be turned on. All requirements as listed in this document regarding social distancing, wearing of masks, and temperature monitoring must be followed while camping on the event grounds. RV HOOK UPS (FRIDAY & SATURDAY NIGHT): \$70 RV HOOK UPS W/EARLY ARRIVAL (THURSDAY, FRIDAY & SATURDAY): \$95 — reserve with Show Secretary when submitting entry forms

CHANGES/CANCELLATIONS: Management reserves the right to combine or cancel any class having less than four (4) entries. Management also reserves the right to change or alter the officials listed without notice prior to or during the show. Not responsible for cancellations due to severe weather or other emergencies.

**CLASS CALLS:** Every effort will be made to maintain a working PA system. However, due to unforeseen problems with any mechanical device, the PA system and paddock calls must be considered a courtesy. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to be sure that his/her horse is at the gate at the prescribed time.

**COGGINS PAPERS:** In accordance with South Carolina State Law, ALL horses on the grounds MUST have a current negative Coggins Certificate (within 12 months). A copy of the certificate MUST be on file in the Show Office. In addition, a copy MUST be posted on stall door for inspection by the State Veterinarian. All non-showing horses on the grounds must be listed on an entry blank and present a Coggins as listed above. ANY HORSE NOT IN COMPLIANCE MUST VACATE PREMISES – NO EXCEPTIONS! **A 30-DAY HEALTH CERTIFICATE IS REQUIRED FOR ALL OUT OF STATE HORSES.** 

**DAMAGE:** The T. Ed Garrison Arena holds individual owners and exhibitors responsible for damages incurred by them, or their agents, to barns or other properties on the show grounds and will bill them accordingly. The Piedmont PFHA, The July Jubilee Horse Show and/or Show Management will in no way be responsible for any loss/damage that may occur. It will be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the horse show, its management and the T. Ed Garrison Arena blameless for any loss or accident to his/her horse(s) or equipment that may occur from sickness, fire, or otherwise. The July Jubilee Horse Show, Show Management or the T. Ed Garrison Arena will not be responsible or liable for injuries sustained in any way to exhibitors, spectators, employees or any other interested parties.

**DISPOSAL OF MEDICAL WASTE:** Sharps containers are provided in convenient locations throughout the barns for the disposal of needles and other disposable sharp instruments. Show Management may fine any individuals, including trainers, owners, exhibitors or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments.

**DOGS ON COMPETITION GROUNDS:** Dogs are not permitted to be loose on competition grounds and must be on a leash or otherwise contained. Individuals must not lead dogs on a leash while mounted. Dog owners failing to comply with this rule may be subject to penalty under Chapters 6 and 7, as well as issuance of warning cards. (See GR 1301.6 of USEF Rule Book)

**ENTRIES: Entries must be RECEIVED by July 20, 2020**. All entries must be made on the entry blank provided. ENTRY FORMS MUST INCLUDE SIGNATURES – ALL RELEASES MUST BE SIGNED AND SUBMITTED PRIOR TO ARRIVAL

Failure to scratch from a class, a "no show," may subject exhibitor to a penalty of \$50. Entry blanks must be completed in full and signed.

Entry deadline of July 20<sup>th</sup> will be strictly enforced! For horses already entered by July 20<sup>th</sup>, you may add classes at the regular pre-entry rate before or during the show. INCOMPLETE ENTRY FORMS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED!

SHOW MANAGEMENT RESERVES THE RIGHT TO REFUSE ENTRIES.

**FOOTING COMPOSITION OF THE ARENA:** Sand, sawdust, top soil mixture, compacted to a medium standard. The competition arena is 140 x 260 ft on floor with offset arena fence

**PARKING:** Horse Trailer Parking is **NOT** permitted in the barn area. Horse trailers and vans must be parked in the designated trailer parking area.

**REFUNDS:** Changes in original reservations must be accompanied by a veterinarian excuse. Owners will be responsible for payment of stall fees unless refund request is accompanied by a veterinarian excuse.

Not responsible for cancellations due to severe weather or other emergencies.

**RETURNED CHECKS OR DECLINED CREDIT CARDS:** All checks returned for non- payment, or credit cards declined, will be charged a \$50 handling fee and must be replaced by cash, certified check or cashier's check. If a returned check, or declined credit card charge, is not made good within 2 weeks after notification, PFHA and USEF will be immediately notified of the non-compliance.

**SHAVINGS:** No outside shavings allowed. Three (3) bags are included with each stall – Contact Julie Aldred for shavings, juliealdred@att.net The stalls at the Clemson facility in barns A and B are asphalt paved. No refunds on pre-ordered shavings.

Additional shavings available (\$8/bag) and can be purchased at the show with Show Secretary, 828-221-4035 or ordered at the show office.

**STABLING:** Stalls are permanent with doors. STALL DOORS MUST NOT BE REMOVED AND THE PANELS MUST NOT BE CUT OR DAMAGED IN ANY WAY. STALLS, WHETHER PERMANENT OR TEMPORARY, MUST BE LEFT IN THEIR ORIGINAL CONDITION. THE T. ED GARRISON ARENA WILL ASSESS A FEE TO ANY EXHIBITOR REMOVING/ALTERING OR DAMAGING THE STALL DOORS. ALL NON-STALLED HORSES MUST PAY A \$25 PER DAY GROUNDS FEE.

STALLS ARE 10x10 WITH FULL DOORS. The stalls at the Clemson facility in barns A and B are asphalt paved. Stabling is in the sole discretion of Show Management.

**STALL INSPECTIONS:** Before admission of horses, the Stable Manager will inspect all stalls. Stalls will again be inspected once occupied and then after they are vacated. Should any damage be found, replacement parts, shipping, handling and labor fees will be assessed.

Motorized Vehicle Statement Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent(s), legal guardian(s), or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. (If your competition bans motorized vehicles, please contact our office for further instruction.)

**Requirement:** Face masks/face coverings must be worn whenever you have the possibility of being within six feet of another person (including members of your own household), except when mounted on a horse or seated in a horse-drawn carriage or cart. *Please do your part and wear your face mask/face covering as required.* 

- Because you cannot predict when another person may be within six feet of you, it is best to keep your face mask/face covering with you at all times while on competition grounds, including those times when you are going to an area where you may be alone or at a greater distance than six feet from another person. This will ensure that you are able to apply your face mask/face covering prior to being within six feet of another person.
- Make sure you are wearing your face mask/face covering prior to entering competition areas where you are likely to be near other people, including areas such as the in-gate, arena, schooling area, restroom, food stand, show office, vendors, stabling, etc.
- If you become hot while wearing your face mask/face covering, move to a location where you are alone or at a distance greater than six feet from another person (and preferably 12 feet or more), and lower or drop one side of your face mask/face covering to cool off.
- If an official, competition organizer or member of the organizer's team requires you to don a face mask/face covering, you must comply.

**Requirement:** All individuals must practice social distancing (or physical distancing) at all times while on the competition grounds by staying at least six feet (about two arms' length) from any person who is not a member of their immediate household. An *immediate* household is comprised of individuals who may or may not be related but are consistently living in the same house or dwelling.

- Members of an immediate household are still required to wear face masks/face coverings when there is a possibility of being within six feet of any other individuals, including members of their own household.
- Competition organizers are encouraged to implement a system that visually (e.g., numbered or colored IDs or some other form of credential) identifies members of the same immediate household.
- If a competition organizer requires that everyone on the show grounds respect social distancing for the consistency of enforcement, you must comply with this requirement.

If face covering and social distancing and/or mandatory requirements are not followed at the competition, it must be reported to the Competition Manager and the Show Steward at the competition. The Show Steward will inform individuals when they are in violation of the mandatory requirements and it will be documented. If a second warning is issued, Competition Management will facilitate the removal of an individual with no refund! The Show Steward must report instances of non-compliance in the Show Steward Report.

### **GENERAL**

- Anyone who has a fever, exhibits COVID-19 symptoms, has tested positive for COVID-19, or has been in contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 cannot enter the competition grounds.
- Such persons need to contact their health care provider immediately and must be cleared by a health care provider before entering the competition grounds.
- If any person on the grounds violates this requirement, competition management has the authority to remove the person from the facility.
- The circumstances of such removal must be documented by the Steward in their Report to the USEF & PFHA.
- In the event of two repeated and documented non-compliance of an individual with regard to best practices and guidelines implemented by the competition organizer, thereby endangering themselves and others, competition management will refer the individual to the steward who is enabled to bar the individual from the competition grounds. NO REFUND WILL BE ISSUED
- The circumstances must be documented by the Steward in their Report to the USEF & PFHA.
- Competition management may limit entries to the competition and to sections/classes to better manage the congregation of horses and people.
- If competition management has to limit entries, individuals who submitted entries after the available spaces were filled will be notified via email that they will be placed on a "wait listing".
- Spectators are prohibited.

### **COMPETITION OFFICE**

- The office window will be utilized for check in and check out, ENTRY TO OFFICE IS PROHIBITED. Social distancing (6 feet spacing between people in line) at the office window will be encouraged.
- ALL ENTRIES must be RECEIVED by July 20<sup>th</sup> please submit all entries & bedding orders via email or mail by the
  deadline. An email will be sent confirming receipt of entries, with a scheduled appointment time for check in
  and if any additional information is needed to complete entry
  - Please be punctual for your appointment time and have all necessary information ready to complete the check in process
- Post Entries will be considered on a first come first served basis at an additional charge and will be accepted
  following pre-entry appointments ENTRY FORMS AND SIGNATURE FORMS MUST BE COMPLETED PRIOR TO

- Competitor show bills will be emailed for review and appointment times to check-out at the competition office window will be assigned.

# **COMPETITION ARENAS, SCHOOLING AND EXERCISE AREAS**

- Practice social distancing in seating areas.
- The number of people accompanying a horse to the ring (e.g. rider, trainer, groom + 1 or 2 additional) will be restricted to comply with social distancing requirements.
- The number of horses in classes will be based on the size of the competition areas and social distancing requirements. All participants will be notified when classes must be split in order to accommodate.
- In order to eliminate hand-to-hand contact, ribbons will not be given out but will be available for photos.

# **STABLING**

- Access to the stabling areas is restricted to veterinarians, athletes, officials, grooms, trainers and other essential personnel.
